Repotting must be performed periodically on your bonsai, Redwood included, when its root system has filled the pot. If you can clearly see the roots coming out of the bottom of the pot, it's time to repot your bonsai. Generally, this means every 2-3 years for a deciduous tree and every 4-5 years for an evergreen.

General Care For Chinese Elm Bonsai Trees Watering your Chinese elm bonsai tree: Water your Chinese Elm bonsai tree once every four or five days. As they are mainly indoor bonsai, water requirements for Chinese Elms will be far less than the outdoor ones.

Generally, this means every 2-3 years for a deciduous tree and every 4-5 years for an evergreen or tropical. Repotting should be done in mid-summer, when the tree is at it's least fragile state. The ligustrum bonsai tree, along with all of its soil, should be removed from the pot.

Any time your tree is inside, the air is very dry, and the leaves want humidity to keep them healthy and green. Mist as often as you like during the day. Definitely avoid having your Bonsai near a vent or a draft, as this will dry out the foliage. Using a pebble tray is a great way to increase local humidity.
