When Should You Change Your Oil?

Run your engine. Raise the car. Get the drain pan in place. Remove the drain plug. Drain old oil. Replace oil plug. Remove existing oil filter. Lubricate the new filter and screw into place by hand. Start the car and look for leaks.

Replace the oil filler cap and run the engine for 30 to 60 seconds. Check for leaks from the oil drain plug and around the filter. Shut off the engine and wait 5 to 10 minutes for the oil to settle into the oil pan, and then check the oil level again.

If your engine has an oil filter, replace it at least once per season. Replace the oil filter by twisting counterclockwise on the body, using a filter wrench or pipe wrench. Examine the sealing surface on the oil filter adapter for debris or gasket material. Clean if necessary.

Depending on vehicle age, type of oil and driving conditions, oil change intervals will vary. It used to be normal to change the oil every 3,000 miles, but with modern lubricants most engines today have recommended oil change intervals of 5,000 to 7,500 miles.

Hold the button down until the "Oil" icon or word starts to flash, or the indicator lights show some other sign of resetting. Some cars will flash the word "Reset," or display the numeral "100" to show that 100 percent of oil life remains after the oil change. Turn the ignition off, wait a few moments, and then start the engine.
