NLN Program Outcomes and Competencies for Graduate ...

Competencies and learning outcomes are two related educational terms that can create confusion. Competencies and outcomes can be written to describe the learning gained by students in individual courses (course outcomes) or for the program as a whole (program outcomes).

Competencies vs Learning Outcomes - SERC

Career readiness is a foundation from which to demonstrate requisite core competencies that broadly prepare the college educated for success in the workplace and lifelong career management. Revised in 2021, there are eight competencies associated with career readiness: career and self-development, communication, critical thinking, equity and inclusion, leadership, professionalism, teamwork ...

What is Career Readiness?

The final two competencies—career management and global/multi-cultural fluency—remain in the same order, but their average ratings fell. In terms of proficiency, employers gave students slightly higher marks on all eight competencies this year, but all ratings still fall in the range between “somewhat proficient” and “very proficient.”
